2017 Election for the City of Framingham

On April 4, 2017 the Town of Framingham voted by charter to become a city. The election on Tuesday, November 7, 2017 requires the establishment of a Mayor and an 11-Member City Council (two Councilors-at-Large and nine District City Councilors) as well a ninemember District School Committee. This election is particularly important because these individuals will become our leaders in the City of Framingham.

Voting in Framingham will be at the normal Precinct Polling places even though the city election is by districts made by combining two precincts. All contests that have more than two candidates for each slot available will appear on the Preliminary Election ballot.

- Final City Election is Tuesday, November 7, 2017 at the designated precinct polling places. Polls are open 7am-8pm.
