An Act to Create a 2050 Roadmap to a Clean and Thriving Commonwealth H.3983 Adopted July 19, 2020

Whereas, Massachusetts passed the Global Warming Solutions Act in August 2008 and,

Whereas, The United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change has issued its fifth report in 2014 showing data required deep cuts in carbon emissions to prevent catastrophic warming and,

Whereas, The U.S, Global Change Research Program has released The National Climate Assessment-Impacts, Risks, and Adaption in the United States confirming climate change is happening now and,

Whereas, The most current data shows climate change is happening faster than models had predicted requiring implementation of net-zero by 2050 and,

Whereas, The data shows the escalating carbon content in the atmosphere now at 418 parts per million the Framingham Democratic Committee therefore would support a friendly amendment to shorten the time to 2040 to meet our greenhouse gas reduction and,

Whereas; Prioritizing local jobs and protections for low and moderate income families and frontline communities that are already subject to disproportionate environmental burdens and,

Whereas, ensuring the entire state is working together cost-effectively by including Municipal Light Plants in Global Warming Solutions Act regulatory process and,

Be it resolved, The Framingham Democratic Committee supports the House Ways and Means Committee reporting out favorably H 832 the Roadmap Bill

Be it further resolved, The Framingham Democratic Committee respectfully urges that the Massachusetts Legislature enact and the Governor sign into law a comprehensive plan to reach net-zero clean economy 2050,
